Does the PVP "Farmer Exemption" apply to varieties with an CSO/SSU? –NO.

Can Conditioners legally clean a variety with an CSO/SSU for a farmer who intends to re-plant? – NO.

Can Conditioners legally clean a variety with an CSO/SSU for a Certified Seed Grower who holds a license for that variety? –YES.

"Certified/Commercial Seed Only" (CSO) and "Single Season Use" (SSU) are licensing agreements that KCIA does not track or enforce. KCIA makes no guarantees regarding the completeness of this list. For ease of use, the list above is limited to wheat varieties certified in Kansas in the past few years.
